Submitting your GPAS status is the only objective way we (at the LMC) have to demonstrate all the exceptionally hard work you are doing in Primary Care especially to our stakeholders and the ICB. Also, unless we receive regular and accurate submissions, we will not be able to determine when there are workload spikes that indicate when General Practice is in distress. **Please help us help you.**

The data helps us gather a true picture of the pressures practices are under. When completing the GPAS form please ensure that you are inputting the correct numbers to avoid incorrect data.

Rebuild General Practice - Patient engagement toolkit

The Rebuild General Practice team have launched a patient engagement toolkit – a collection of materials that will help GPs to convey the crisis in general practice to their patients.

- 1. Ask your patients and/or friends to join Rebuild General Practice in calling on government to fix the crisis, using the templates in the toolkit (MP letter, social posts, etc.)
- 2. Display the patient engagement animation on the screens in your surgery to show patients the reality of the crisis and let them know how they can help (See animation below)
- 3. Share social media thread and post your own: Rebuild General Practice GP social media posts Google Docs
- 4. Encourage GPs and colleagues in general practice to do the same by sharing materials with them.

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GP Registrars survey highlights increased levels of burnout and worries about future

A <u>survey by the BMA's GP Registrars Committee</u> showed that qualified doctors who are training to become GPs in the UK are facing increased levels of burnout and are worried about their career and health prospects early in their careers.

In addition, under 10% of those who took part in the survey said they intend to work as a full-time GP, with just less than 20% stating that they feel confident of their future as a GP working in the UK.
